Our recent Science in Action event was a wonderful success, and it was a pleasure to welcome so many parents and carers to London Enterprise Academy.

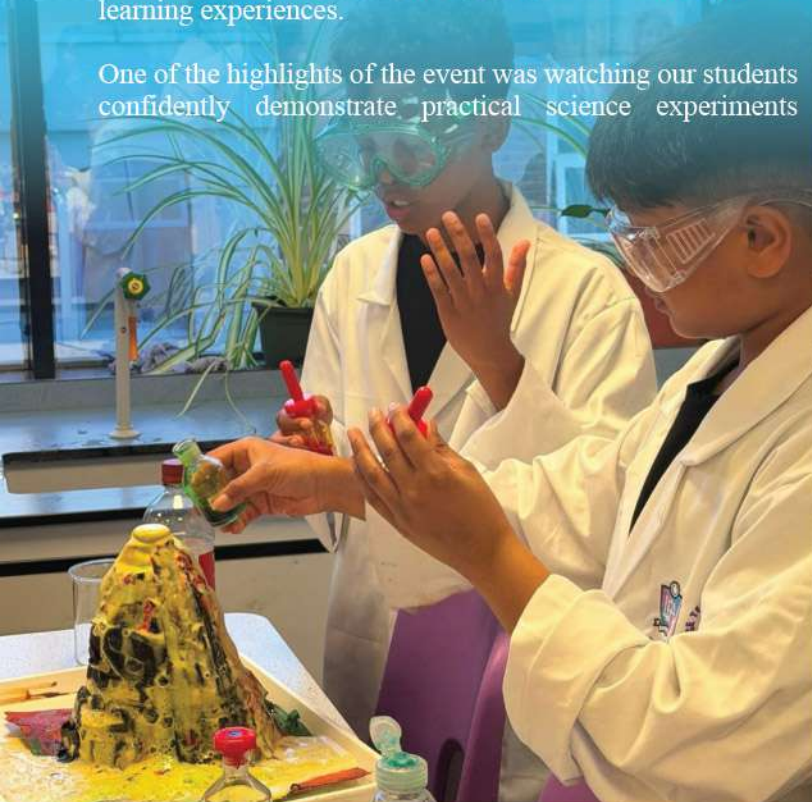

Year 8 Enterprise and Social Action Project

Over a 12-week programme, Year 8 students at London Enterprise Academy participated in an exciting Enterprise and Social Action Project designed to develop their understanding of entrepreneurship, leadership and social responsibility.

Throughout the programme, students explored the principles of enterprise, identified local and global social issues, and developed innovative ideas to create a positive impact within their communities. Working collaboratively in teams, they researched charities, planned fundraising initiatives, developed marketing strategies and prepared professional presentations to showcase their ideas.

The project culminated in a school final, where a diverse panel of students presented their proposals to teachers and invited guests. The standard of presentations was

exceptionally high, demonstrating the students' enterprise skills, entrepreneurial thinking, leadership, perseverance, determination, teamwork and excellent communication skills. The judging panel was highly impressed by the confidence, professionalism and passion shown by all participants.

The winning team selected by our esteem panel of judges, Human Relief Foundation (HRF UK) as their chosen charity. Year 10 Geography Fieldwork Trips

Our Year 10 GCSE Geography students recently completed two compulsory fieldwork visits, which are an essential part of their GCSE course and will be used as evidence in their Paper 2 examination.

For their physical geography fieldwork, students visited Herne Bay to investigate the effectiveness of coastal management strategies. They examined features such as groynes and collected a range of primary data using specialist fieldwork equipment, helping them understand how coastal defences reduce erosion.

For their human geography fieldwork, students travelled to Stratford to investigate quality of life in two contrasting locations. They carried out Environmental Quality Surveys

(EQS) and gathered evidence to compare different urban environments, developing their enquiry and data collection skills.

Throughout both trips, students represented the school exceptionally well. They were polite, engaged and demonstrated excellent behaviour while working independently in the field. After completing their data collection, students also had the opportunity to enjoy some well-earned free time, including a visit to the arcade and a game of football, making the day both educational and enjoyable.

Year 10 Mathematics Trip to *Bletchley Park*

Our Year 10 students recently enjoyed an inspiring educational visit to Bletchley Park, the historic home of Britain's wartime codebreakers. The trip provided a fascinating opportunity to explore the role that mathematics, technology and problem-solving played during the Second World War.

One of the highlights of the day was visiting Huts 8 and 11, where students learned about the extraordinary work of the codebreakers who deciphered encrypted German communications. They also explored the Artificial Intelligence Exhibition, discovering how the pioneering work carried out at Bletchley Park has influenced modern computing and the rapid development of AI.

Students enjoyed a captivating cinema experience that brought to life Bletchley Park's crucial role in supporting the Allied war effort and explored the historic mansion, helping them connect classroom learning with the people and places behind one of history's most significant intelligence operations.

A particularly memorable activity gave students the opportunity to attempt contact with the International Space Station using radio waves. Although they did not speak directly with an astronaut, they successfully made contact with an amateur radio operator in France, providing an exciting real-world demonstration of international communication.

The visit enriched students' understanding of mathematics, history and computing while encouraging curiosity and critical thinking. Throughout the day, our Year 10 students represented the school exceptionally well, demonstrating enthusiasm, respect and excellent behaviour.

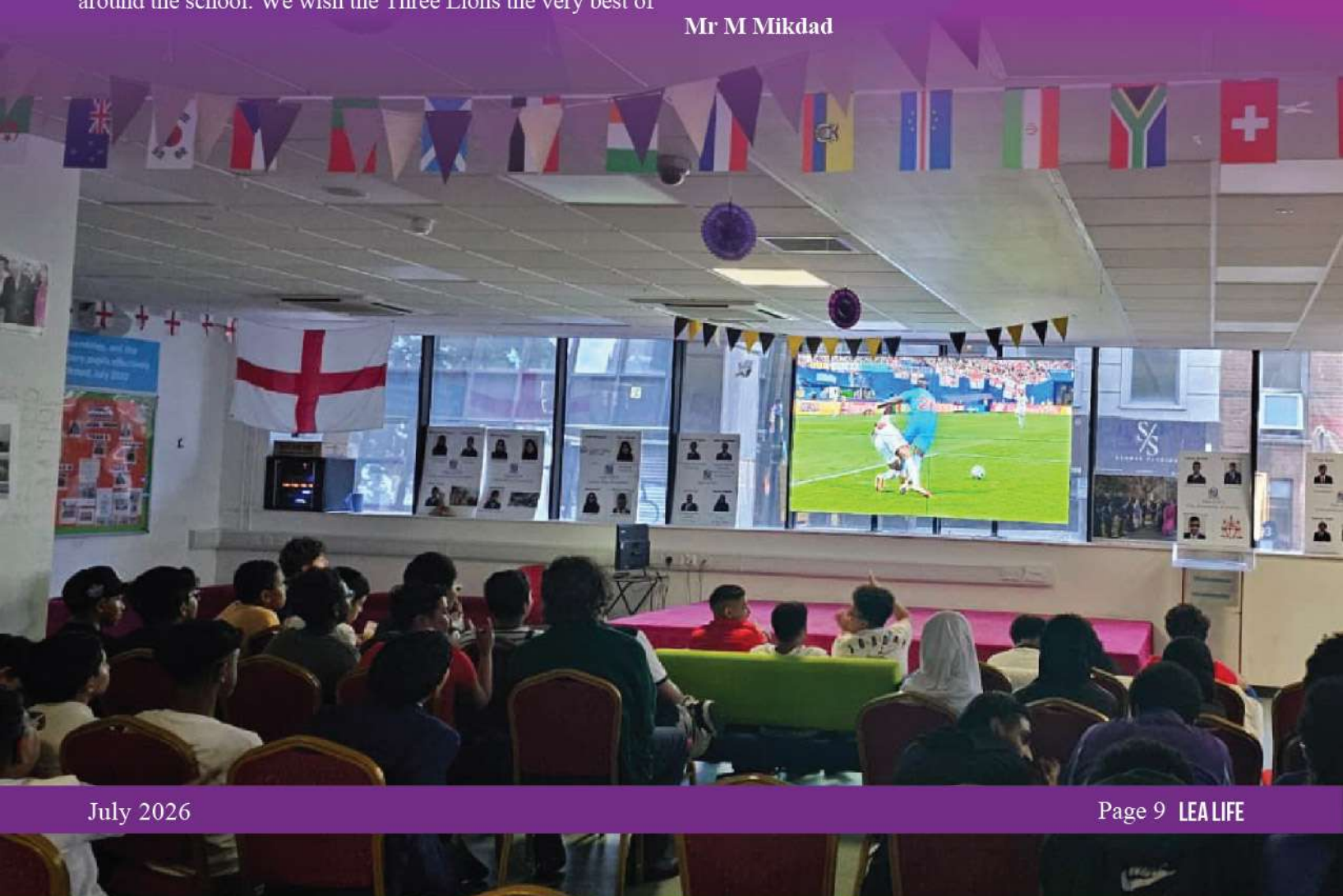
Our Students Are Backing England

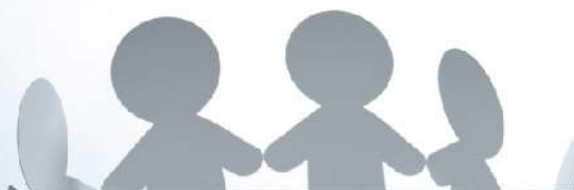
afternoon of fun, teamwork and friendly competition.

Safeguarding



Dear Parents and Carers,

At London Enterprise Academy, safeguarding is our top priority, and we want to work together with you to ensure the safety and wellbeing of all our students. This term, we are addressing key local safeguarding concerns affecting young people in Tower Hamlets. Please take a moment to read through this newsletter for important updates, advice, and support available to families.

Local Safeguarding Concerns

Online Safety - Risks of Social Media Challenges and Grooming

Many children and young people are accessing social media platforms, where they may encounter harmful content, including viral challenges and online grooming.

We encourage parents to:

- > Regularly discuss online activities with their children.
- > Check privacy settings and parental controls.
- > Monitor their child's screen time and online interactions. Visit [National Online Safety](#) for helpful resources.

Substance Abuse – Vaping and Other Risks

We have seen an increase in young people using vapes, sometimes containing harmful substances such as nicotine or THC. Many e-cigarettes marketed towards teenagers contain unknown chemicals, which can be dangerous. Vaping at a young age can lead to addiction and long-term health issues. Parents can help by:

- > Talking to their children about the risks of vaping and substance abuse.
- > Watching for signs of use, such as unusual smells, coughing, or behavioural changes.
- > Encouraging open discussions and setting clear expectations about substance use.
- > Seeking support from school or local health services if needed.

Exploitation and County Lines

There has been an increase in reports of young people being targeted by criminal gangs through 'county lines' drug operations. Signs to look out for include:

- > Unexplained money or gifts.
- > Changes in behaviour or new, unknown friendships.
- > Regular absences from home or school. If you have concerns, please contact the school or report anonymously via Crimestoppers (0800 555 111).

Knife Crime and Youth Violence

Sadly, youth violence continues to be a concern in parts of East London. We are working closely with the local Safer Schools Police Team to educate students about the risks and consequences of carrying weapons. Parents can help by:

- > Having open conversations about peer pressure and staying safe.
- > Encouraging children to avoid risky situations.
- > Reporting any concerns to the school or police via 101 (or 999 in emergencies).

Mental Health and Wellbeing

- > Many young people are struggling with anxiety, stress, and pressures from social media and school life. Support is available through: Kooth – Free, anonymous online mental health support (www.kooth.com).
- > CAMHS Tower Hamlets – NHS mental health services for young people.
- > Encouraging healthy routines, regular exercise, and open family discussions.

Support for Families

We understand that parenting can be challenging, and we want to support you. Here are some key services available in Tower Hamlets:

- Tower Hamlets Family Information Service – Advice and support for parents (www.towerhamlets.gov.uk/fis).
- The Parental Engagement Team – Free workshops and parenting support. Local Food Banks – If you are struggling with food security, support is available via First Love Foundation.
